What we need is to conserve both the renewable and non-renewable resources, provided by nature if we really need to save mother Earth.

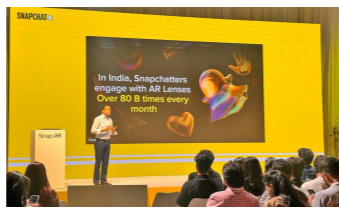

Teachers accused of sexual assault in Sabarkantha, Amreli

Ahmedabad, Gujarat is often seen as a 'safe state' in India. However, with increasing number of sexual abuse and rape cases being reported in the state, that tag is fast getting eroded. After a teacher in Amreli's Vanda area sodomised a male student, another report of a teacher in Himmatnagar sexually assaulting a teenage girl has come to light.

The accused teacher in Sabarkantha lured the girl under the pretense of cutting a birthday cake and took her to a guesthouse on Idr Road in Sabarkantha where he sexually assaulted her. The incident came to light after the girl's parents filed a complaint, causing a major uproar.

As per reports, the victim is a class 10 student, and the accused is an English and Sanskrit teacher at her school. Under the false pretense of celebrating her birthday, he took her to a guesthouse and assaulted her for two hours, leaving her in distress. The girl's health deteriorated, and later, the teacher abandoned her at the civil hospital before fleeing. Following the complaint, the police have registered a case and initiated legal proceedings to apprehend the accused teacher. Reports emerged on Wednesday about a teacher from a private school in the Vanda area of Savarkundla taluka, Amreli, committing a shameful act. A complaint of sexual assault and an unnatural act has been registered at the Vanda police station.

The accused, Vishal Savaliya, worked as a hostel warden and was responsible for the sports and general department of the private school. He lived in a room opposite the hostel and would call the student to his room to commit the crime. The incident occurred on February 5 and later the student began experiencing pain in his lower back. When the family visited the hostel to bring him food, they noticed he had a fever and took him home. It was then that the student revealed the horrifying incident to his family, leading to the revelation of the entire case.

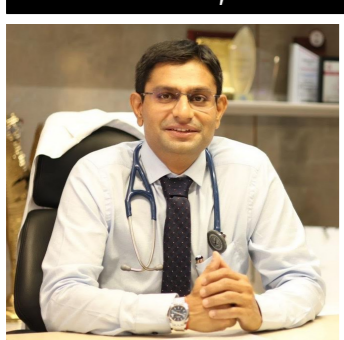
Indian Life insurers register record new business figures in January 2025

Ahmedabad, The Life Insurance Council has released updated industry business numbers for January 2025, revealing positive trends in key areas. New business premiums (NBPs) underwritten by Indian life insurers have achieved a YTD growth of 7.78% compared to the same period last year. YTD collections grew from ₹283833.52 Crs to ₹305912.09 Crs this year. The life insurance industry saw individual single premiums growing by 16.26% on a Y-o-Y basis, closing at ₹4127.67 Crs for Jan'25, with

YTD growth at 14%. Individual non-single premiums reached ₹10632.32 Crs, growing by 10.52% in Jan'25, and YTD collections settled at 14% higher than the corresponding period last year. This strong performance can be ascribed to the fact that life insurers are increasingly focusing on encouraging first-time life insurance buyers to buy essential life insurance solutions, contributing to the 12.07% growth in combined individual premium collections for the month of Jan'25 and 14% growth on a YTD basis. -

How immunotherapy is helping breast cancer patients

Ahmedabad, Breast cancer is one of the most common cancers worldwide. It begins when cells in the breast grow uncontrollably, forming a tumour that can spread to other parts of the body. The disease can present in various forms, with the most common being invasive ductal carcinoma (IDC) and invasive lobular carcinoma (ILC). Risk factors include genetic mutations (such as BRCA1 and BRCA2), family history, hormonal influences, and lifestyle factors. Early

detection through screening methods like self-exams and mammograms are crucial for improving survival rates. Treatment options for breast cancer typically include surgery, chemotherapy, radiation, and targeted therapies, but advanced treatments like immunotherapy are offering hope for patients.

Immunotherapy helps the body's immune system target and fight cancer cells. While chemotherapy uses drugs to kill or stop the growth of cancer cells, immunotherapy uses the body's immune system to fight cancerous cells, offering a more targeted approach. This is especially beneficial for patients with more aggressive forms of breast cancer like the triple-negative breast cancer (TNBC). For both patients and caregivers, immunotherapy brings new hope to fight cancer. (1-7)
